Different Themes - preliminary program

Youth Unemployment

This is one of the most important issues in the nearest future and there are several major initiatives to combat youth exclusion to the labour market. We will meet the Swedish *Theme Group on Youth* and listen to their knowledge of successful methods to get young people into the labour market.

We will also listen to some ongoing major initiatives to establish flagship cooperation in the Baltic Sea Region. But there will also be other examples of youth projects.

Equality

The *Theme Group of Equality* in Sweden will share the experience that they have gained during this programming period. Their publications about "Empowerment in the labour market", "A sustainable working life", "Norm critical approach", "Involvement – methods on Equality", among others will be presented.

Furthermore we will have the opportunity to listen to some successful project dealing with different issues on equality, inclusion and anti-discrimination.

Disability

The Swedish Agency for Disability Policy Co-ordination (Handisam) are responsible for the implementation of disability policy in Sweden. Their experiences are deep and we will listen to some of their experiences. We will also share the experiences from some projects focusing on the disabled.

Social Innovations

The Swedish Research organization FORTE (earlier FAS) are researching about the labour market, work and health and work organizations among other things. They will share some interesting findings about the need for social innovations in order to keep the welfare standards in society.

We will also learn from others that have made true social innovations in order to create inclusion opportunities for those excluded from the labour market.
